Executive Summary



Response Information

This online survey of 1,377 U.S. adults aged 18 and up was conducted from May 19 to 24, 2023. The data were weighted to the U.S. population by nine demographic variables. The credibility interval for questions answered by all respondents is plus or minus 4 percentage points.

Topline results presented in this report were weighted to be representative of the overall population by the following variables —


- State: California (12%), Texas (9%), Florida (7%), New York (6%), Pennsylvania (4%)
- Region: South Atlantic (20%), Pacific (15%), East North Central (14%), Mid-Atlantic (14%), West South Central (12%), Mountain (7%), West North Central (6%), East South Central (6%), New England (5%)
- Children in household: Yes (30%), No (70%)
- Marital status: Married (48%), Single (35%), Divorced (12%), Widowed (5%)
- Gender: Woman (51%), Man (49%)
- Age: 18-34 (31%), 35-44 (17%), 45-54 (18%), 55-64 (17%), 65+ (16%)
- Education level: Less than HS (12%), HS graduate (28%), Some college (31%), College graduate (18%),
 Postgraduate (10%)
- Household income: Under \$50,000 (39%); \$50-\$99,999 (30%); \$100,000+ (30%)
- Ethnicity: White, non-Hispanic (66%); Hispanic (15%); Black, non-Hispanic (12%); Asian (4%); Other race (3%)



Summary of Results

- Nearly half (47%) of American adults have heard of a fictional of constructed language such as Klingon (39%), Valyrian (18%), Dothraki (17%), or Esperanto (9%).
- Few (5%) have ever studied such a language though: Klingon (2%), Esperanto (1%), Valyrian (1%).
- Of those who have studied a conlang, only one respondent rated themselves "Proficient" in the language. Self-assessments of their skill: Beginner (58%), Elementary (21%), Intermediate (13%), Advanced (7%), Proficient (1%).
- Six out of ten Americans (62%) have reported watching a show or movie where people used fictional languages. One out of five (20%) have read about fictional languages.
- One out of ten Americans have invented a bit of a language themselves (11%), though many of these creations were variants on Pig Latin or ciphers.



Anecdotes

"I worked on inventing a language when I was in junior high to go with the book I was writing. In the end I wound up with an alphabet with 32 characters and sounds. I didn't know enough about languages to construct word roots and variants. I just had some translations for a few words."

"Friends and I created a language that was similar to Tolkien's Elvish so we could 'hide' our intentions from adult. Years later I can't remember any of it. During a reunion we discussed a dictionary one of us had saved."

"I didn't have a name but we worked with these vowels, 'a,e,i,o,u' where A was 1, E was 2, I was 3, O was 4, and U was 5. So for every word, wherever these vowels they get replaced with the numbers. And wherever a consonant is, an 'a' is added as a suffix. Example, 'crazy' is going to be 'cara1zaya'."

"Languages for *alien* aliens. By that, I mean aliens so alien to us that there is almost no commonalities we can lean on to help us understand each other... Perhaps biology so different that the lifespan of one is button instant to the other. How would species like these communicate at all, how would they become aware of each other or how could they become aware of each other. And perhaps as importantly could they have anything meaningful to say to each other?"

"There were several for Dungeons and Dragons campaigns for tailormade characters and some when I was younger so quite complex for fun, mostly with runes for letters."
